Brier City Council Minutes

October 24, 2000

Mayor Kaske called the regular meeting of the Brier City Council meeting to order at 7:30 PM and the flag salute was given.

Roll Call:

Present: Councilmembers Colinas, Jordan, Moller, Starks, Doolittle and Warner.

Absent: Councilmember Magnuson

Reports of Committees and City Officials:

Councilmember Jordan reported that the Police Department is satisfied with the Preliminary Budget figures and he is waiting to get more numbers on leasing versus purchase of vehicles. Councilmember Jordan reported that the Police Officers inquired as to how the Pepsi machine is filled and they had discussed vendors for it. Mayor Kaske reported that, on November 16th, there is going to be a meeting in Bellevue to answer questions on inflow and infiltration and what may occur after the study regarding rates, costs, and grants.

Public Requests and Oral Communications: None

Consent Agenda:

Mayor Kaske opened for consideration the Consent Agenda. <u>Councilmember_Colinas</u> moved and <u>Councilmember Warner</u> seconded to approve the Consent Agenda, which included approval of the Brier City Council Minutes of October 10, 2000 and approval of Ordinance No. 158.B adopting a moratorium on Right-of-Way permit issuance. Motion Carried

Unfinished Business: None

Hearings:

Mayor Kaske opened the Public Hearing on the proposed Six Year Street Plan. Mayor Kaske declared a ten-minute recess at 7:40 PM to make additional copies of the Six Year Street Plan for the public. The meeting reconvened at 7:51 PM. Debbie Herman, Poplar Road, asked about the sidewalk by the school. Mayor Kaske explained how part of the sidewalk was put in because an outside company installed a fiber optics duct system in that area and how a grant had been applied for 233rd and 35th Avenues but the grant had not been approved. Sue Kernodle, 23321 35th Avenue W., asked if the sidewalks would be done in 2001 or in 2002 and discussion followed about the possibility of doing it in phases. Bev Hennum, 24083 34th Place W., expressed concern that the children are not able to ride a bus because they are so close to the school that Edmonds School District does not provide bus service for them, so there is no choice for them and that she hopes the sidewalks would be a high priority. A gentleman in the audience asked for sidewalks directly in front of the school on the west side of the street. There was audience

discussion with Council. Marilee Collins, 2680 Elm Drive, asked if anyone of the Council had been there as the kids come out like bees from a hive and children are monitoring children as crossing guards and she stated that there were enrollment issues with the number of children attending the school. Bev Hennum asked about resubmitting the grant application and asked that the fact that it involves an elementary school be included in the application. Darlin Phraner, 3612 233rd Place SW, drew a picture on how she takes her child to school and showed the areas that she felt needed sidewalks even if it takes a bond issue. Debbie Furman asked if the Edmonds School District had any financial responsibility regarding sidewalks as it is a school issue. Angie Acheson, Brier Road and 230th, stated there should be adult supervision at intersections. Sue Kernodle stated the Brier Police sit in her driveway and try to help and she wants the Police to stay on 233^{rd.} Janet Alley, 23224 34th Avenue W. asked if they were going to have sidewalks in 2002 and stated she is confused as to when it would be done and if there was money. Discussion followed between the audience, Council, and the Mayor. Councilmember Colinas moved and Councilmember_Moller seconded to close the Public Hearing on the proposed Six Year Street Plan. Motion carried.

New Business, Petitions, Communications, Application Appeals, etc.: None

Consideration of Bids, L.I.D.'S and Related Matters: None

Ordinances, Resolutions and Orders:

Mayor Kaske opened for consideration the adoption of Resolution No. 457, adopting the Six Year Street Plan. <u>Councilmember Colinas</u> moved and <u>Councilmember Doolittle</u> seconded to approve Resolution No. 457 adopting the Six Year Street Plan. Motion Carried. There was continued Council discussion regarding parents getting involved and stopgap measures that could be taken such as flashing lights.

Miscellaneous Business by Call of Councilmember and City Officials:

Mayor Kaske opened for discussion regarding the issues and questions for study on dissolving the Medic 7 organization. Mayor Kaske asked the Council if they had any questions or issues that they may have regarding dissolving Medic 7. Councilmember Colinas stated that his concern was where all the Capital Equipment would go. There was Council discussion.

Councilmember Colinas asked if that the 2001 budget would be discussed at the next November workshop. Councilmember Colinas stated there is a water valve raised up in the street on 214th and asked for Public Works to check on it.

Councilmember Warner stated that the Code Publishing CD was very good and there was discussion regarding the availability for use of it.

Mayor Kaske stated he heard from the Mountlake Terrace City Manager that they had received the Fire Contract proposal and they are working on revisions and would contact

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us in the near future regarding it. Mayor Kaske reminded Council that the 26^{th} of October is the regional dinner at the Howard Johnson Hotel.

Adjournment:

Councilmember_Moller moved and Councilmember_Colinas seconded to adjourn. Motion Carried and the meeting adjourned at 8:52 PM.
